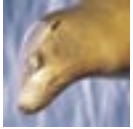

About The Course

The University of Wisconsin-Madison's Marine Mammal Conference is designed to broaden the horizons of current and (through the involvement of the School of Veterinary Medicine's Wildlife, Exotic, and Zoo Animal Medicine club) future veterinary practitioners. At the same time, by bringing together speakers from across the country to address diverse topics in environmental, research, and captive management, it shows that veterinary medicine is a universal art. The factors that affect the health and well being of marine mammals affect all animals, including humans, to varying degrees. Likewise, the tools used and difficulties commonly encountered in medical treatment of these species are often nearly identical to those used and seen when dealing with animals more common to insular (and seasonally frozen) areas like Wisconsin. Regardless of whether our patients have flippers, fur, blowholes, or horns, veterinary medicine is one.
